services are provided by paid or unpaid caregivers in a person's own home to help them live as independently as possible

#### **Home Health Care**



Offers part-time medical services ordered by a physician for a specific condition



require home health care in the U.S.



of home health care recipients are women



#### **Homemaker Services**



Offers personal care and assistance at home, such as meal preparation and chores

- Services may be provided for reasons of:
  - illness
  - disability absence of caregivers
- to prevent adult abuse/neglect

**COMMUNITY-BASED CARE** 



Focuses more on support services to help recipients maintain their home



services provide recreational and social opportunities

as well as personal care in a home-like environment

Offers health, social, and other services in a safe place during the daytime as their family caregivers go to work



of participants are 65 years old and below



Nearly half of all participants have some level of dementia

### **Assisted Living**



Offers daily health care and assistance, housekeeping, and 24-hour supervision and part-time medical care for residents



More than half of residents are are at least 85 years old and are mostly



Median length of stay is 22 months

## **FACILITY-BASED CARE** provides 24-hour full-time assistance

and medical care as needed
